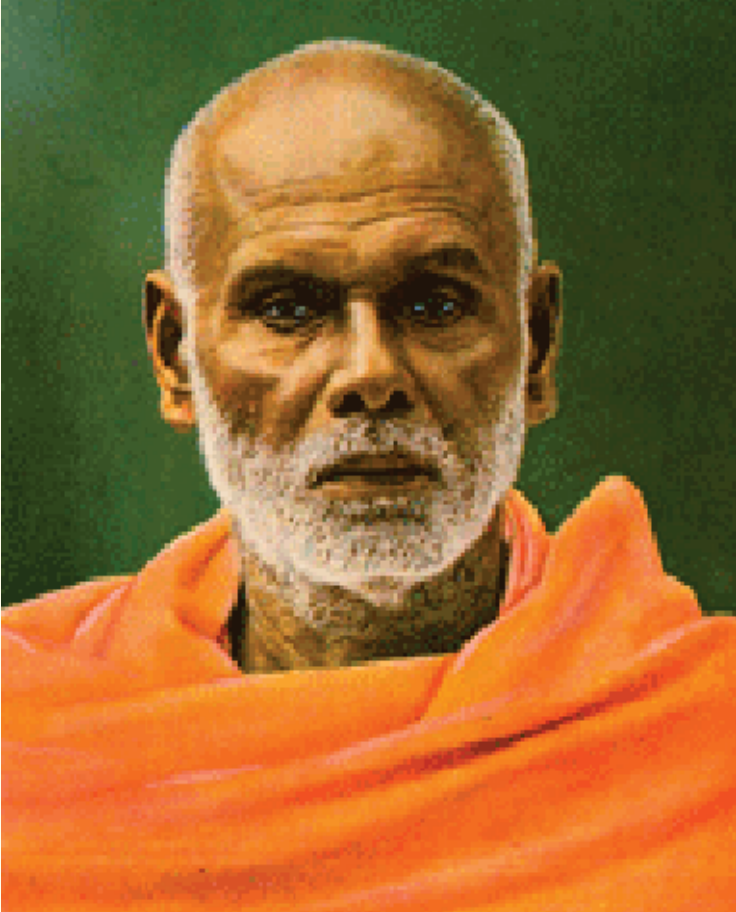

About the College

It was an era, when higher education was considered as the privilege of a few in the society. Many young aspirants of higher education, with poor upbringing knocking at the doors of many institutions in Mangalore, had to return empty handed unable to get a seat to pursue their studies. Naturally they had to discontinue their education with a lot of frustration. At that time, a farsighted leader Sri B Janardhan Poojary, Ex-Minister of State for Finance, Government of India, expressed his concern before the members of Shree Venkatesha Shiva Bhakthi Yoga Sangha that, there is no substitute to education to bring an individual from the lower rung to the position of strength and confidence. Therefore, to infuse strength and confidence in the underprivileged, neglected, and not so meritorious sections of the society, the establishment of an educational institution is the only way out. Accordingly Shree Gokarnanatheshwara College, saw the light of the day in the year 1982 and has dedicated itself since then, for the cause of social justice and this institution would not have come into existence, but for his timely help.

The scholastic achievements of the students stand out as a testimony to the concerted endeavor, which is put in at three different levels, i.e. teachers, support staff and enlightened management. Shree Gokarnanatheshwara College has grown in its own unique style and has been shaping the destiny of thousands of students with good head and heart, combined with competence and excellence.

It is our core objective to lay stress on care and concern for the underprivileged sections apart from other educational, idealisms. It is equally important that values are reflected in the functioning of our institution. It is the institutional vision that our institution should be the learning center for 'denied ones' in shaping their future in the right perspective.

Aims & Objectives of the Institution :

The College aims not merely at providing sound liberal education, but producing useful, intelligent, patriotic, emotionally integrated, morally strong, scientifically tempered and healthy young men and women, under the management of Shree Venkatesha Shiva Bhakthi Yoga Sangha.

Vision of the College

~ Provision of sound liberal education, to economically and socially backward

and repressed sections of the society and contributing useful, intelligent, strong, confident, healthy and socially sensitive youth.

Mission of the College

- ~ To impart quality education to every willing mind irrespective of merit and means.
- ~ To kindle innate strength hidden within each student by encouraging him to unearth the potentialities through various activities.
- ~ To propagate the true idealism of humanity and brotherhood through value based education.

The vision of the college is to impart quality education to those who desire it, so that irrespective of their affordability, the younger generation can become quality citizens of the civilized society.

General Regulations and Code of Conduct

1. Classes will be held between 9.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m and 1.30 p.m to 4.30p.m on Mondays to Fridays and between 9.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m. on Saturdays. Saturday afternoons will be devoted to NSS/NCC/Sports and other extra curricular activities.

At the first warning bell for class, given 5 minutes before the hour, students enter class and occupy their places. At the second bell, the lecturers enter classes and the students stand in silence to receive them. At once all pray in silence to obtain God's blessings in the work before them.

2. Late comers can enter the class only if permitted by the lecturer. They may be marked present at the end of the hour only if there was sufficient reason for being late. Those who depend on public conveyance to come to the college should leave their homes early enough to avoid peak hours and be at the college well in time.
3. During class hours the lecturer's permission is needed to move away from one place or to leave the room.
4. Irregularity in attendance, insubordination, discourtesy to staff members, habitual inattention and late coming, neglect of work, obscenity in word or act are punishable by permanent or temporary dismissal. Minor offences are punishable by a fine or loss of attendance.
5. Every student should possess Identity Card which should be produced when asked for, especially in dealing with the Office and Library.
6. Punctual and regular attendance is essential for the formation of character and is therefore insisted upon. Leave of absence from college should be obtained from the concerned authority. Unforeseen absence must be justified on return before entering the class with a note of excuse from the parent or guardian. A medical certificate should be furnished especially when a student is absent for a long time due to illness. **A medical certificate however does not entitle a student for attendance.** The names of students who are absent continuously for 2 weeks without any notice will be struck off from the register.

Those who are deputed officially by the college to participate in academic, cultural or sports activities should hand over a note of deputation signed by the concerned lecturer to the academic advisors.

Serious notice will be taken of absence without leave from the college examinations, at the reopening of classes after the holidays. In the case of illness, the production of medical certificate is required.

7. The college does not hold itself responsible for conduct of its students outside its premises. Injustice to itself however, it takes cognizance of any serious misconduct of its student committed outside its premises and should any serious charge be fairly substantiated, the guilty shall be punished according to the gravity of the offence.
8. Progress report of students shall be issued after the examination. The report card should be returned within 3 days duly signed by the parent/guardian.
9. The applications of the student whose progress, based on the performance in the terminal examinations, if not satisfactory will not be recommended to the university for the annual examination.

10. Every student must salute members of the staff on the occasion of their first meeting for the day.
11. Books, magazines, newspapers etc, not approved by the Principal, are not allowed to be brought to the college.
12. Those who drive motor cycle, scooter, mopeds should have valid driving licence and insurance. To avoid noise pollution and disturbance the vehicle should have sufficient silencers. Students are allowed to park their vehicle only in the place allotted to them. However four wheelers are not allowed.
13. Consuming alcohol or using tobacco, drugs in any form in the college premises is prohibited. If they do so they will be summarily dismissed
14. Books, umbrellas etc should have a name or mark by which the owner can be easily known. All stray or unclaimed property should be brought to the notice of the Principal.
15. Students are required to live either with their parents, relatives or guardians or in hostel or lodging house. Residing in hotels is not permitted. Outstation students living in rented house/flats should invariably inform the Principal regarding details of place of residence.
16. Students must not join any club or society or make any engagement that may interfere with their studies without the Principals permission. They are not allowed to play in any team against the college.
17. Students are not allowed to take part in any political agitation directed against the authority of the Government. They are also forbidden to engage prominently in any public movement without permission from the Principal. They are further required to observe all the disciplinary regulations which the Management may frame from time to time.
18. Letters officially addressed to the Principal should enclose reply postage. Only official letters will be handed over to the students. Private letters will be redirected to the home or hostel address.
19. Attendance at classes and examinations, progress as well as the conduct of the student will be taken into consideration while recommending students for merit certificates, concessions, scholarships, higher studies, jobs as well as for representing college in extra cultural activities.
20. Students are not authorised to collect donations from the public or from their fellow students for any of the college activity without the permission of the Principal. Educational tours/picnics are to be organised with prior permission of the Principal. For all such programmes written permission of the parents is required.

21. Students are not permitted to celebrate any religious festivals within the college campus without the prior permission of the Principal.
22. Willful damage to the property of college books, furniture, water, gas and electrical installation etc. will be viewed seriously. In case of damage to the college property, the cost of repair and any other charge will be collected from the student. But if the persons who are responsible for the damage are not identified, the cost of repairs etc may be collected equally from all the students of the college. The decision of the Principal is final in all these matters.
23. If on occasions the students have free hour they should go to the reading room or student's common room. In either place they should engage themselves in serious work such as reading or writing.
24. All extra curricular activities cease at 5.30 P.M.. Students have to vacate the college campus by 5.30 P.M. unless a teacher is present with them.

Student Counseling Cell : Student Counseling Cell aims at helping the students not only with their academic difficulties but also with their personal and emotional problems. Dr. Renuka K. Principal, Dr. Ummappa Poojary P. of Commerce Department, Dr. Sujaya Suvarna, Department of History, H.O.D. Counselor in charge of Counseling Cell. Students and parents may always approach him for guidance and help in their academic, personal and emotional problems.

Grievance Cell : Grievance Cell is functioning in the college to deal with genuine grievances of the students. A suggestion cum grievance box is also kept near the Principals chamber. Students can make use of the box for bringing their grievances to the notice of the Principal through the cell. They can also present their grievances personally to Dr. Ashalatha Suvarna of the Commerce Department.

PLEASE TAKE SPECIAL NOTE

Students are strictly not permitted to possess and use mobile phones, cellular phone and pagers within the college premises. Such items if confiscated, will not be returned. Again penalty will be levied for such an act.

Students attending class or other gatherings within the college are expected to be neatly dressed in accordance with the rules of approved etiquette. Violation of uniform dress code is not tolerated. Wearing of indecent dresses, T-Shirts, Fancy Ornaments (boys), Long hair (boys) is strictly prohibited.

Without obtaining prior permission from the Principal, no picnics,

send-off parties, get together, in which our students are involved, either in the campus or in any other place are to be organised. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate these rules.

Indulging in tuition outside the college is strongly discouraged. Students who have particular difficulty in any subject are recommended to approach the lecturers for help. They are also advised to attend remedial classes organised for such students.

75% attendance in each subject is compulsory to qualify for the university examinations. Only the University can condone attendance below 75%.

Under Credit Based Semester Scheme students are required to compulsorily take part in Co-curricular and Extra-curricular activities during the first four Semesters. which will be evaluated in terms of marks and credits.

THE ACADEMIC ADVISOR AND TUTORIAL SYSTEM

1. The tutorial system in the college is organised with a view to develop the student teacher relationship effectively on an intimate, mutually helpful and co-operative basis.
2. Each student is placed under the charge of an Academic Advisor who is a member of the teaching staff of the college and act as the class guide.
3. The students are encouraged to consider their Academic Advisor as their local guardian within the college.
4. Students should meet the Academic Advisor as often as possible within the college and discuss freely and frankly their problems connected with the college and studies.
5. Each class will be under the charge of an Academic Advisor who will look into the general discipline and progress of the class.
6. The parents of the students are advised to contact the respective Academic Advisor at least once in the term to know the attendance, progress and discipline of their ward.
7. The report about each student will be submitted to the Principal by the respective Academic Advisors at the end of every term. The progress report will be sent to the parents at the end of the term examinations.
8. Leave applications by the students should be submitted through the Academic Advisor.

TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Parents and guardians are requested to co-operate with the college authorities by enforcing discipline, so that students should be devoted to study at home. If parents do not insist on regular attendance and home study, the results are sure to be disappointing to them.

Absence from a class should be justified by a leave note from the student signed by the parent/guardian. A leave note for a long absence due to illness ought to be supported by a medical certificate. A medical certificate does not entitle a student for attendance.

Absence from college examinations will be considered seriously. Absence, even for one subject should be justified by a written note. A medical note is needed in case of illness. Re examinations cannot be considered as a matter of right. In case of illness during the examinations, parents are expected to inform the Principal immediately.

Some parents express their surprise at the end of the year, at the unsatisfactory attendance and progress of their children inspite of sending reports to them. Progress reports of students will be issued after the examinations. Some students failed to hand over their progress reports to their parents/guardians. You are requested to come over to the college office and check in case the reports are not received by you within the reasonable time.

You are asked to meet the Academic Advisor or other lecturers if unsatisfactory progress or poor attendance is brought to your notice. The minimum of 75% attendance is required to complete the course without which a student is not eligible to appear for the final examination. They will not be readmitted to the college.

We expect parents to participate in parent meetings and other activities of the college like founders day, sports day, prize distribution day, college day etc.

Attendance at Parent Teacher meeting is mandatory. In case you are not able to attend for a just reason, a written note should be sent to the Principal.

Parents are specially requested not to allow their children to use motorized vehicle without a valid licence and insurance.

Use of mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the college premises. So parents are specially asked not to allow their children to bring cell phone to the college. Uniform dress code is to be followed on all days.

Students are prohibited from wearing, fancy ornaments (boys), long hair (boys). Parents kindly advice your children in this regard.

Credit Based Semester Scheme

Mangalore University has introduced Credit Based Semester Scheme in its undergraduate degree program with effect from the academic year 2006-07. Under the scheme each course shall carry certain number of credits. Credits normally represent the weightage of a course and deal with the function of teaching learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, maximum marks etc. In the program, in general 2 hours of instructions per week in a Semester is assigned one credit. In terms of evaluation, one Credit is equivalent to 50 marks in a Semester. On these basis, a three year degree program will have a maximum of **5000 marks and 100 credits**. The other important features of Credit Based Semester Scheme are :

- The degree programmes are structured on Semester basis; 2 Semesters in a year and 6 Semesters during 3 year degree program.
- The subjects of study include Foundation Courses, General Studies, Interdisciplinary subjects apart from the 2 Languages and prescribed Optional subjects.
- The students are required to compulsorily take part in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities during the first four Semesters. which will be evaluated in terms of marks (50 marks x 4 Semesters = 200 marks = 4 credits)

MANGALORE UNIVERSITY
REGULATIONS GOVERNING CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM FOR BACHELOR
DEGREE PROGRAMMES IN THE FACULTIES OF ARTS AND COMMERCE
(Framed under Section 44 (1) (c) of the KSU Act 2000)

Preamble:

The University Grants Commission, New Delhi, has directed all Universities in the country to implement the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS, Semester Scheme) in both the under graduate and post-graduate programmes and has been issuing a series of guidelines with regard to this. The Choice Based Credit System enables the degrees of Mangalore University to be on par with the global standards. Given the present trend of globalisation, it is all but fitting that Mangalore University should adopt the CBCS so that the acceptability of the programmes and degrees offered by the University becomes comparable and readily acceptable. The University considered the feasibility of CBCS at several levels and through the meeting of several of its statutory bodies. After due consideration, thus, the following Regulations were drawn up.

The Salient Features of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) (Semester Scheme):

Each course in a programme shall carry certain number of credits, which normally represent the weightage of a course and are a function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, etc. In the proposed programmes, in general, 2 hours of instructions per week in a semester is assigned one credit. In terms of evaluation, one credit is equivalent to 50 marks in a semester. On the basis of these parameters, a three year degree programme will have a maximum of 100 or 104 credits.

The other features of the CBCS (Semester Scheme) are -

- i. The 'Degree Course' is to be replaced by 'Degree Programme' and the term 'Subject/Paper' is to be replaced by 'Course'.
- ii. The Under Graduate degree programmes are structured on Credit Based Semester Scheme.
- iii. The relative importance of courses of study and activities are quantified in terms of Credits. Total credit of the programme is in the range of 100-104.
- iv. Each programme of study will have "Core courses", "Electives" (of Group II & Group III), "Foundation" courses and "Extra and Co-curricular Activities".

The Core courses will consist of compulsory/optional courses which are compulsorily studied by a student in all six semesters, whereas Elective and Foundation courses are opted in I to IV Semesters.

Elective courses are :

- a. Supportive to the discipline of study.
- b. Providing an expanded scope.
- c. Enabling an exposure to some other discipline/domain.
- d. Nurturing students proficiency/skill.

The student shall opt any one of the elective courses (a to d) in each semester.

The Foundation course will consist of compulsory foundation and elective foundation. Two languages are compulsory foundation, whereas i) Constitution of India, ii) Human Rights, iii) Gender and Equity, iv) Environmental Studies are elective foundation courses which shall be studied in any of I-IV semester by opting one in each semester (I to IV).

- v. RANK : A student who secures 60% (A Grade) & above in all the Semesters in FIRST ATTEMPT is eligible for RANK (If passes the Semester in parts then eligible only for Class and not for Ranking).

To pass in a U G Program a candidate should get Minimum Aggregate GPA of 3.0 and Course Alpha Sign "C".

Classification of Successful Candidates

At the end of **VIth Semester** - Candidates shall be **classified** on the basis of % of Marks obtained out of 5000 + Average Marks obtained in all the Semesters + the Aggregate Grade Point Average.

Examination

- A candidate shall appear for all the subjects of a year / Semester when he appears for the first time, provided he/she does not have shortage of attendance in any subject.
- There will be Two Internal Examinations in a year/Semester on the basis of which internal assessment marks will be awarded.
- Appearance for all the examinations is compulsory. Penalty will be levied if a student abstains from any examination.
- Prior permission of the Principal must be obtained, in case any student is unable to write the examination.
- Students must possess admission tickets and identity cards while appearing for the University Examinations.

Payment of Fees :

Tuition fees for the year is payable not later than the day prescribed in the calendar. If a student fails to pay the fees by the date he will have to pay fine as prescribed per day of delayed payment. If the fees is not paid within 15 days, the student's name will be struck off from the rolls.

LIBRARY RULES

1. The college library will be kept open from 9.15 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. on all working days (Saturday 9.15 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.) and from 9.15 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. during vacation
2. Students shall maintain strict silence within the library premises.
3. News papers and magazines will not be issued to the students, it is available in the library for reference.
4. Marking with pen or pencil on the books or magazines of the library is strictly forbidden.
5. Each student will be issued two borrowers ticket which entitles him or her to borrow two books at a time and the tickets will have to be returned to the librarian at the end of the year to claim no due certificate.
6. Books will not be lent to the students unless they produce their own tickets.
7. If the ticket is lost the fact must be immediately brought to the notice of the librarian and a duplicate ticket will be issued on the payment of the prescribed fee.
8. The books borrowed from the library should not be sublet by the borrower.
9. Application for books should be submitted on the previous day after 4.00 p.m. for the issue of books.
10. Books may generally be kept for one week and the due date will be stamped on the due date slip. In case the due date falls on a holiday, the book shall be returned on the next working day.
11. The book may however be renewed for another week if there is no other application for the same.

12. A student who fails to return the books on the due date will be fined 25 paise per book per day.
13. If a book is not returned to the library within a month the matter will be reported to the Principal.
14. If a student finds that books issued are not in good condition the matter should be immediately brought to the notice of the librarian, otherwise he or she will be liable to be held responsible for any damage to the book which the librarian may notice on its return to the library.
15. Books lost, torn, defaced, marked or damaged in any way shall have to be replaced by the borrower along with a fine as fixed by the Principal.
16. Books from the reference section will be issued to students at 4.00 p.m. and will have to be returned to the library on the next day before 9.30 am.
17. A book may be reserved for a reader provided he / she makes the application to the librarian for the same before 10.00 a.m. and such books should be collected within 24 hours of the librarian's information that the book is available.
18. Students should note that the library must not be used as a common room and must be made use only for the purpose of study. Any misbehavior of the student inside the library will be reported to the Principal by the librarian and he or she will not be given any library facility until he/she get the Principal's permission.
19. At the end of the academic year all the library books must be returned to the library on the day fixed during March. A fine of 50 paise will be levied per day if the book is not returned on the said date.
20. Any book lent out may be recalled by the Pprincipal at any time even before the due date of returning.
21. Any damage to the furniture or property in the library will have to made good by the person concerned.

REGULATIONS REGARDING SCHOLARSHIPS AND FREE SHIPS

- 1) Free ships, scholarships and loan scholarships are granted reliably in accordance with the rules prescribed by the concerned Govt./ Dept. authorities.

- 2) If, after a student has been selected for the award of freeship/ scholarship or loan, there is a deterioration in his/her conduct or progress or there is decline in his/her attendance in class he/she is liable to forfeit the award.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION

Students of the college are required to attend the medical examination as per the regulations of the University. They must report without fail on the prescribed date to the doctor named for the purpose by the Principal. Failure to do so will entail disciplinary action by the Principal. However for genuine reasons he/she may request the Principal for a change of date.

Credit Based Semester Scheme

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The degree programmes are structured on Semester basis; 2 Semesters in a year and 6 Semesters during 3 year degree program.

- The subjects of study include Foundation Courses, General Studies, Interdisciplinary subjects apart from the 2 Languages and prescribed Optional subjects.
- The students are required to compulsorily take part in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities during the first four Semesters. which will be evaluated in terms of marks (50 marks x 4 Semesters = 200 marks = 4 credits)
