The peer team from National council of Accreditation and Assessment Constituted by UGC visited the college on 28th and 29th of July and commenced the work done by the college and awarded with B+ grade, which has infused in us new strength and confidence.

COLLEGE BUILDING:-

The college building consists of spacious classroom, Principles chamber, staff room, Ladies room, computerized office, stock room, library, reading room, laboratory, computer room, sports room, NCC room, NSS room, Photostat copy room, Multi gymnasium, HRD and career guidance room and mini auditorium.

COLLEGE LIBRARY:-

To begin with, there cannot be knowledge discrimination without a treasure house of knowledge to draw upon from. Hence our Library support service contributes and supplements knowledge for the progress of students. The library services ensured their accessibility to all the students. Materials and facilities and access to latest books and discipline, based journals and magazines are made available to the students. The positive attitude of the library staff helps in encouraging students to fully utilize the services available in the library.

COLLEGE FACULTY:-

The faculty consist of Arts, Commerce, Management and language for B.A, B.Com and B.B.M. There are 17 full time permanent lecturers drawing UGC scale with two of them having availed the facility of doing Ph.D under the faculty improvement programmes. Three-faculty member are management paid to teach B.B.M. classes.

The college offers 3 years Degree course in B.A, B.Com & B.B.M and certificate course in Veda & Tantragama.

SPORTS & GAMES:-

The students are provided with modern facilities to develop their skills and sports and games like volley ball, badminton, cricket, kabaddi, athletic, power lifting, wrestling, kho-kho, chess, tenni koit, and table tennis. Out students earned many medals and trophies in sports and games. Multi gymnasium worth Rs. 3 lakhs has been set up by utilizing the HRD grants. Separately for boys and girls.

Our college students have done well in the field of sports and games during the academic year 2004-05. Many students participated in the All India

Inter University, State level, Divisional level, University level and District level and brought credit to the college. Inter collegiate wrestling competition which was held in our college and our college wrestling team bagged the team Championship Award in the Mangalore University.

NCC:-

We have NCC Army wing in our college. The total enrolled strength of the NCC wing is 50 cadets including 16 girl cadets. NCC training is imparted on Saturday after class hours.

NSS:-

Community development is and important responsibility of the college to bridge the gap of knowledge and development in various social scientific and cultural aspects between the privileged and under privileged sections of the society. Hence our college has undertaken extension activities of through NSS with a social commitment. The aim to create a knowledge oriented society which will eradicate superstition, un-hygienic methods of living, addiction, corruption environmental destruction etc.

For the year 2004-05, 125 students enrolled their names in NSS. Campus cleanliness, One-day camp, Annual special Camp and community development programme were conducted through NSS.

HRD & CAREER GUIDANCE:-

HRD is a planned and continuous process of learning and growth designed to induce behavioural change in individuals by cultivating their mental abilities and inherent qualities through the acquisition, understanding and use of new knowledge, insights and skills. Career guidance and placement services refer to provision of linkage to the campus life of students with the realities to be faced by them when they seek employment or opt for further higher studies.

Our college this year has conducted many programmes on leadership and personality development, group discussion on career guidance.

The learner centred teaching method such as group work, role-play, project work, field visit, case study debates etc. are also adopted to supplement the classroom teaching. It is also seen that the faculty members prepare their own

visual and teaching aids and make liberal use of OHP, PC etc. The preparation of enrichment programme for the advanced learners and remedial teaching to the slow learners helped in a long way to learn. Advanced learners are helped by providing extra handouts / reading materials and are encouraged to consult reference books, websites etc.

A notable practice in the formation of study groups consisting of strong and weak students in which the strong ones help the weak ones in their studies. Such peer caring benefits students much more than conventional teaching methods.

Field trips, educational trips, Projects departmental seminars, guest lecturers by experts from outside help the students to develop the ability to learn on their own. Diversified teaching methods are used including focused group discussions, brain sessions, role playing, games case discussion, home assignments, project study undertaken by the students.

36. Activities of the Guidance and counseling unit.

Guidance and counseling support service will contribute to enable students to overcome their inhibitions, and linguistic barriers, stress etc. and bring about a change in their mindset and motivate them to do better.

Immediately after the admission into the First year, students are placed under the able guidance of Academic Advisors. Orientation and induction Programme is conducted to create a sense of confidence among the students. Under this programme Academic Advisors enlighten the students on the areas like course and course contents, hours of study, examination system, evaluation pattern, Internal Assessment, attendance, term, Library facilities, co-curricular activities, discipline, code of conduct etc. This exercise helps in assessing the mind set, competency and skills possessed by the students thereby enabling the teachers to identify their strengths, weakness, family, cultural, economic and social background. Therefore guidance and counseling work is done by the Academic Advisors and at present no separate guidance and counseling unit is established.

Health service

In association with Shree Venkatesha Shiva Bhakthi Yoga Sangha our college conducts free medical camp every Sunday for the poor localities in and around Mangalore. Even free medicines are also distributed.

Good conduct

Education is character building. So to promote good discipline and culture among the students, every year on the eve of Annual Day, good conduct scholarship is awarded to one boy and one girl student of each class, based on the conduct of the student inside and outside the college.

Departmental Library

Each department has a departmental library and concerned students can borrow the books from the departmental library where the department maintains the Register for the purpose.

It facilitates to express the students grievances through dropping letter into the complaints and suggestion box. The suggestion box will be opened once in 15 days by the concerned grievance cell in charge faculty member in the presence of Principal.
