Students of each class are placed under the able guidance of Academic Advisors.

39.HEALTHY PRACTICES OF THE INSTITUTION:

The Management offers scholarships to deserving and meritorious students to pursue their studies.

CHERISIHING THE MISSION OF THE FOUNDER OF THE COLLEGE:

Our College in collaboration with Shree Venkatesha Shiva Bhakthi Yoga Sangha every year celebrates the birth anniversary of Brahma Shree Narayana Guru a great visionary of the depressed classes highlighting his message to the society through the Inter-collegiate Elocution competitions Inter School Essay Writing Competition. In this connection a Rangoli and Flower Arrangement Competitions, Drawing Competitions were conducted. In order to popularize the guru among the masses, a procession of students, Principal, Staff and Management is taken from the college campus to Shree Gokarnanatha Temple is held which finally culminates with a Puja held in temple at 8 p.m.

FREE MEDICAL SERVICE: In association with Shree Venkatesha Shiva Bhakthi Yoga Sangha, our College conducts free medical Camp every Sunday for the poor residents in around the City of Mangalore. Follow up of patients is properly monitored in the records of

the doctors and free medicines are distributed. Patients are regularly visiting the camp for the past 10-15 years.

GOOD CONDUCT: To lay emphasis on good conduct and discipline among the students every year during the College Day Celebrations, , Good Conduct Scholarships are awarded to a boy and a girl student of each class , on the basis of the recommendation of the Academic Advisor and Principal in consultation regarding the conduct of the student inside the College campus and outside the campus and taking into account minimum merit of the student.

DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY:

Each department has a well equipped library. Students avail these books and the departments maintain a record of the books borrowed.

FACILITIES PROVIDED TO THE PUBLIC:

The College gymnasium is open to the public after the College hours. The College Hall is provided for conducting elections, spiritual discourses, Yoga classes, dance classes, This year the Open University Examination was held. (The English Board of Examiners) for over a month availed the services of the College for preparation of the April /May English Examination Question papers. The College even permits Valuation work to be held in the campus. Premises. Shree Venkatesha Shiva Bhakthi Yoga Sangha every year distributes free Note books worth Rs.40,000/- to the needy and deserving school children.

INNOVATIVE TEACHING TECHNIQUES, SEMINARS, GUEST LECTURES:

To instil genuine admiration for the subjects taught, innovative methods of teaching are followed, such as case analysis, group discussion, use of audio-visual techniques, preparation of charts, project work, individual and historical field visits and reports are compiled by students. The tradition of appointment of Academic Advisors. The record of Bio-data along with cumulative records, remedial classes for the weak students are strictly adhered to.

HONOURING AND FELICITATING:

Mr. Devadas, Contractor, and President of Shree Venkatesha Shiva Bhakthi Yoga Sangha on receiving the prestigious Swarna Jayanthi Karnataka Rajyostava award for his struggle to include Kasaragod in the State of Karnataka was felicitated by the College Management and the staff by a Shawl and a momento.

OTHER HEALTHY PRACTICES:

Maintenance of the College campus is monitored on a regular basis by the N.S.S. and N.C.C. students. The system of keeping parents informed regarding the progress of the wards, calculating attendance shortage once in 2 months, collecting the signature of the parents specially of the failed students soon after the Terminal Exams is adhered to.

Providing free mid-day meals to students, dress code to the students. Aqua guard facility, bathroom facilities for sports students who practice before the College hours and after is practiced. Every Thursday the last hour from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. is exclusively devoted to extra-curricular activities and to value education classes.

A student grievance Redressal Cell is functioning in the College to give expression of the complaints and grievances of the student fraternity. Students drop letters in to the complaint or suggestion box, which would be opened by the Principal once in 15 days, by the grievance Cell in charge faculty member in the presence of the Principal.

LIBRARY FACILITIES: Students are issued book bank books in the beginning of the year which they can retain with them till the end of the academic year. On the security of a Deposit students are eligible to retain the borrowed books during the examination period. The practice of issuing borrower's tickets, exhibiting the newly arrived books, providing access to reference books etc., is carried out.

Every year students participate in the Yakshagana Programme and provide entertainment to the general public at Shree Gokarnanatha Temple during the Dasara Festival there by emphasizing the need to preserve the ancient art of Yakshagana of Dakshina Kannada District.

FARE-WELL FUNCTION TO OUTGOING STUDENTS:

In order to enable the students to contemplate on the merits of the Course and to provide a platform of thanks giving a farewell function is organized every year for the out going students.

The Management including the Correspondent of our College meets the students every year inorder to enquire about the complaints or grievances of the students and assures them improvement in the college infrastructure facilities and caters to their welfare. Personal contact with the students creates a good rapport between the stakeholders and the students.

To encourage the students to secure higher percentage in the examination a special prizes of Rs. 1 Lakh is announced by the Management to those students who secure a rank in the Public Examinations.

In the begining of the Academic Year an orientation programme is conducted by the respective academic advisors to introduce the students to the various college activities throughout the year. They are informed about the rules and regulations of the College for the use of the library and of the terminal and final University Examinations. They are also informed about the availability of scholarships, loans and other financial assistance. The College Calendar is also distributed to the students.

To ensure accountability on the basis of the syllabus prescribed by the University the teachers maintain a work diary and the Principal's signature is sought at the end of each month.

Valued Test and terminal examination scripts are returned to students and discussed in class so as to notify the right answers and to felicitate better student teacher interaction.

The performance of the teaching faculty is evaluated by students by means of a teacher Assessment Questionnaire and fed back is obtained by he Principal regarding the teaching in the class room, support services etc.,

At the end of the Academic year to maintain the infrastructure a furniture stock verification is conducted where by broken window panes benches and desks are brought under the perview of repair. Toilets are cleaned on a daily basis by a workman under the direct supervision of the Principal. Class rooms too are swept regularly and cobwebs are duly cleaned up.

A medical test is conducted for students every year whereby the height, weight and dental, sight and other health related problems are looked into.
